Recycling for the Future by Kate Grover

As Earth Day approaches I have been thinking about our Hallmark culture and how passionate we are about recycling. Recycling adds essential value to our company and returns money to our Greetings Facility. Emphasizing recycling as a vital part of our manufacturing culture will continue as we consolidate into one Production Center through 2013.

During 2012, our Environmental Champions developed new signs for recycling that will be installed above each recycling area as the Facility is reset. The new signs are standardized and utilize Lean principles. The signs not only label each recycling stream but also show examples of what to place in each stream; provide bulleted points on what not to recycle in that stream; and have representative dollar signs. The dollar signs graphically demonstrate that the better we sort our recycling streams the more revenue returns to our facility offsetting the overall cost of greeting card conversion. The new recycling signs have started appearing in Packaging and will roll-out as each area is consolidated.

In addition to new signs, we have had a couple of substantive changes in our how we will sort our recycling as we consolidate. For Lawrence Hallmarkers, we have added a stream for Hard White. Topekans are very familiar with Hard White because the generation source is Department E. Hard White is white paper only with no print. This recycle stream includes not only waste paper from Department E but finished envelopes that have no print and no tint. Off-white and ivory envelopes now must be added to the Light Print collection gaylords. For Topeka Hallmarkers we have an additional material sort for composting. Composting paper products and food waste used in the Crown Room and Break Rooms reduces the amount of waste we send to the landfill. The compost we help create is then used to benefit organic gardeners, commercial landscapers, homeowners, municipalities and regional environmental projects.

Of note is that according to the webpage Green Waste, (http://www.greenwaste.com/recycling-stats) when we recycle one ton of paper:

- •3.5 cubic yards of landfill space is left empty and seventeen 30 foot (pulp) trees are left standing
- •7,000 gallons of water are available for other uses and 380 gallons of oil are not used

•4,100 kilowatt hours of energy are not consumed

In 2012, Lawrence and Topeka combined recycled a total of 7,198 tons (14,395,750 pounds) of paper. That is an amazing feat to consider as we continue to consolidate employees and cultures throughout 2013. As the 43rd Earth Day quickly approaches on April 22, our company remains committed to recycling; encouraging us all to be thoughtful stewards of all of our earth's natural resources.
