Greetings Flow and Tooling Integration (GFTI) Update

The more the merrier!

Welcome Tooling Hallmarkers!

The month of June will bring more significant capabilities to the Greetings Plant. Already the laser for the Steel Rule department has been installed and operational for the last couple of weeks, laser cutting large and small die-cut boards. Later this month the bending operations, along with CAD operators from Steel Rule will relocate to Lawrence on the south end of the first floor. This move adds an additional 11 operators to our ranks. Welcome!

In addition, you may have noticed the shelving being installed on the second floor at the south end. This shelving is the future home of the dies used for the foil and emboss processes. Over the month of June more shelving will be erected in preparation for moving the dies stored in Kansas City out to Lawrence in mid-July. As many of you know, these dies require a "counter" to make the emboss impression or foil transfer and these counters are made via an "Acraplate" press. One Acraplate will be moved in June in advance of the other milling equipment used to makes these dies and counters. Then, starting in mid-July, for the next consecutive weeks the milling equipment and other Acraplates will relocate to Lawrence on the south end of the second floor.

Equipment Moves

The pace of the equipment moves continues with the Gietz foil press on the first floor moving to accommodate the Steel Rule operations above. This move will complete the majority of large press moves for the flows on the first floor.

The Flows

The flows physically in place on the first floor are shown below with the volume percentage of cards produced in each flow relative to total cards produced at the Greetings Plant:

Litho / Large Die-cut / Packaging

Litho / Foil / Large Die-cut / Packaging ~15%

Litho / Spot-coat / Foil / Emboss / Large Die-cut / Packaging ~5%

These three flows account for 40% of the plant volume that has the potential to run through these flows.

Over the past month more flitter lines have moved to the first floor. This is the start of enabling an additional 10% of volume to run through the main flows on the first floor.

⇒ Litho / Large Die-Cut / Virko or Flitter / Packaging ~10%

The final main flow is... drumroll... you guessed it... the flow that includes Bronze which was our original pilot flow. This flow contributes an additional 5%.

Litho / Bronze / Foil / Emboss / Large Die-cut / Packaging

Of course, not all of the press moves have occurred, so the full volume through these flows and dedicating work to these flows has yet to be realized.

Thanks again for your patience and perseverance through these changes. A nimbler, faster, more responsive Greetings Plant awaits us on the other side of these changes. We are the ones to take ourselves there!
