## Safety Corner - Building Safety Month

# Here are some best practices to keep your home and family safe:

- Install & Maintain Smoke Alarms: Install at least 1 smoke alarm in every bedroom, outside of each sleeping room area and on each level of a multi-level building and test them regularly. Smoke alarms can't help you unless they are functional and you can hear them.
- Use Electrical Cords Safely: Overloaded outlets and undersized electrical extension cords can cause a fire or electrocution danger. Never overload electrical cords or power strips. Don't use appliances that have damaged cords. Extension cords should not be used as a substitute for permanently wired outlets.
- Maintain Safe Exits and Passages: During a home emergency, such as a fire, it's important that all occupants are able to get out, and emergency personnel are able to get in as quickly and easily as possible. Keep hallways clear of obstructions and do not block or obstruct emergency escape windows and exit doors.
