# Welcome Tooling!



Welcome Tooling! We now have our full complement of Hallmarkers from the Tooling Area located in the Lawrence Greetings Plant. This includes the Laser and Steel Rule Department, along with its CAD operators; the CNC (which stands for Computer Numerical Control) Mills that mill the emboss and raised-rounded foil dies along with their Mill Path Specialists; and the Die Storage Area which assembles the tool kits for both large and small presses.

Unbelievably, we moved 60,000+ dies over 5 days ... 20 trailers of dies... !! Incredible !! Fantastic job in that this move was done safely, timely and accurately. Thank you and congratulations to the teams working in both KC and Lawrence that made this happen. In physically moving this inventory of dies, we also had to transfer the work in progress and move the inventory in SAP. As with any transition, this transition has had its challenges and we have struggled to keep tooling flowing to large press. We are close to this process normalizing, and there has been a great effort by all to identify the work to keep large press and packaging moving. From the week of the move of the Die Storage Area, 7/18, through last week, 8/1, the plant has produced 20 MM, 23 MM and 21 MM cards, respectively, and we look to have another great week this week of 8/8. Great work by everyone!

Of course, we knew this was "a tough row to hoe" when we began these tooling moves and now we are in our last weeks of Christmas production. But to use another old saying, "when the going gets tough, the tough get going", so we appreciate and need your continued effort and dedication to complete the Christmas work.

In order to meet our Christmas ship date, Christmas jobs should be prioritized above all other work.

Continuing with the press moves, the second Acraplate molding machine, the press that makes the counters for the raised-rounded foil and emboss dies, was moved into position this week. After this press move, we have only one other Acraplate press move left to complete the tooling portion of the GFTI (Greetings Flow and Tooling Integration) project. After the completion of Christmas production and Labor Day the internal press moves will recommence.

Already we can see the benefits of having Tooling and Production Services closer together. Through the transition we realized we can capitalize on the tool kits being ready one day earlier than what occurred with the previous process with Tooling in Kansas City. This one day saved is one day closer to our goal of improving lead time. Already Large Press operators have made inquiries of their counterparts in Milling to understand their work and vice versa, making suggestions about how to minimize mill time, eliminating waste and increasing the throughput of this operation.

With the Tooling Integration and setting the plant up for Flow, we continue to make strides in reducing lead time, work in process inventory and cost of product. Thank you again for your continued support and hard work, and please keep your focus on safety and throughput as we work to complete the Christmas production.
