### September 11th

September 11 is National Patriot Day. By presidential proclamation, Americans are called on to observe [Patriot Day](#) each September 11 with a moment of silence beginning at 8:46 AM Eastern Daylight Time, the time the first plane struck the North Tower of the [World Trade Center](#) on September 11, 2001. Individuals observe the day with ceremonies and activities, including remembrance services.

Two New Year celebrations take place in September. **September 11** is the Ethiopian New Year (Enkutatash). The celebration is both religious and secular with the day beginning with church services followed by the family meal. After attending church in the morning, families gather to share a traditional meal of *injera* (flat bread) and *wat* (stew). Later in the



day, young girls donning new clothes, gather daisies and present friends with a bouquet, singing New Year's songs. And **September 24 (sunset) – September 26 (nightfall)** is Rosh Hashanah, a holiday recognizing the Jewish New Year. It is the first of the Jewish High Holy Days, and is marked by prayer, repentance, and rest. It is both a time of rejoicing and of serious introspection, a time to celebrate the completion of another year while also taking stock of one's life.

## How to Make a Home Fire Escape Plan

- ⇒ Draw a map of your home. Show all doors and windows.
- ⇒ Visit each room. Find two ways out.
- ⇒ All windows and doors should open easily. You should be able to use them to get outside.
- ⇒ Make sure your home has smoke alarms. Push the test button to make sure each alarm is working.
- ⇒ Pick a meeting place outside. It should be in front of your home.
- ⇒ Everyone will meet at the meeting place.
- ⇒ Make sure your house or building number can be seen from the street.
- ⇒ Talk about your plan with everyone in your home.
- ⇒ Learn the emergency phone number for your fire department.
- ⇒ Practice your home fire escape drill!
- ⇒ Include safety ladder for two story homes.
