Veterans Day

Veterans Day is an annual holiday in America honoring the millions of military veterans in the US. In 1918, on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day in the eleventh month the world rejoiced and celebrated because after four years of bitter war, the Allied powers signed a cease-fire agreement (an armistice) with Germany at Rethondes, France on November 11, 1918. This brought World War I to a close. November 11, 1919 was set aside as Armistice Day in the US, to remember the sacrifices that men and women made during World War I in order to ensure a lasting peace.

In 1953 townspeople of Emporia, KS called the holiday Veterans Day in gratitude to the veterans in their town. Soon after,

Congress passed a bill introduced by a KS congressman renaming the federal holiday to Veterans Day. Beginning in 1954, the US designated November 11 as Veterans Day to honor veterans of all U.S. wars. In 1971 President Nixon declared it a federal holiday on the second Monday in November each year.

Holiday Road-Trip Survival Tips
