New Tissue I

In May of 2011 the appropriation for the purchase of our second tissue line was approved with the caveat that it would be placed in service in 2011 to take advantage of the available tax incentive. Global Procurement finished final negotiations with Moeller, Hugo Beck, and Rennco and they were contracted by Hallmark to provide a Moeller tissue folder, Hugo Beck retail packager, and a Rennco whole-

sale bagger. This is a very specialized production line that can produce 4"x10". 8"x10", and 8"x20" packages as well as dual. tri, and quad packs.



This project was a total team effort

from the moment the appropriation was approved and three subteams were formed to tackle the various aspects of this project. A Production Transition team was formed at Corporate with members from packaging engineering, procurement, distribution, and SAP in order to prepare Hallmark, system and inventory wise, for the installation of a new press. In Leavenworth, a team was formed of managers, operators, maintenance technicians, and facilities personnel to finalize the layout, prepare the site, monitor the construction and shipments of the new equipment, and lead any other efforts through the completion of the project. In addition to the Production Transition team at Corporate, a team was formed in OTIS to construct the auto-packer that will work in sequence with the Moeller, Hugo Beck, and Rennco equipment. Without the collective efforts of all involved in this project, it never would have left the ground.

In November of 2011, a sub-team consisting of Michelle Spencer, Larry Wistuba, Jamie Wilbanks and John Moore traveled to Germany for the acceptance test of our new machine. The team spent 6 days in Germany for the test where Moeller demonstrated the capabilities of the press as well as performed some additional run tests during the time there. All in all, it was a very successful acceptance test and with our approval, the line was shipped from Germany to Leavenworth where it arrived at the beginning of December.

Installation of the press began on December 8th and with the help of three Moeller technicians, was completed and place in service prior to our December 23, 2011 target, thereby ensuring that Hallmark would receive the full tax benefit available. Moeller returned on January 9 to provide operator training which was completed on January 20. They have plans to return in a few months to continue with some of the more difficult formats that were not previously covered as well as refresh what was learned in the initial training sessions.

The new tissue line is now up and running production daily. In the coming weeks, the auto-packer will be placed in line and run tested. As soon as installation and debugging are complete, we can look forward to running the complete line as it was designed.

While there have been bumps in the road, the tissue team in Leavenworth has been steadfast in their progress and we all look forward to being a part of the new capabilities this line provides.
