## EFFORTS FOCUS ON INCREASTING TISSUE CAPACITY

From vendor visits exploring new static eliminators, to eliminating variation in our poly widths, and researching different types of rollers/belts, the Tissue team is working on solving problems! Every day the team experiences issues that result in equipment downtime.

Why eliminate downtime? Because our customers WANT tissue and MORE than we can currently produce on our 2 lines. This results in the need to outsource packaged tissue that we want to produce internally.

During the Kaizen event the team identified over 40 ideas that we will systematically work to review, resolve, and improve. Even seemingly small issues, such as splices that were causing web tears/breaks caused further exploration. The root cause? The splice tabs/spoilage tabs used at Printco had excess adhesive on the top side, which unfortunately was just enough to cause both sides of the tab to stick. Switching to a different tab vendor has eliminated this problem. Although, this problem with the splice tabs was not the biggest contributor to downtime on the tissue line, resolving it will reduce downtime and increase uptime. And minutes add up to hours, and hours add up to days!

We have also spent time writing and reviewing many different Standard Operating Procedures. SOP's will allow for consistency on how the equipment is maintained and run. It sets the basis for future improvements to be evaluated and implemented. **Stay tuned for future updates!**
