# THE BUCK STOPS HERE!

One of only 14 U.S. Presidential Libraries, the Harry S. Truman Library and Museum's two permanent exhibits chronicle the Missourian's private life and political career -- with exhibits depicting his most difficult decisions like entering the Korean War, using the atomic bomb, the Cold War and recognizing Israel. Two floors of exhibits in this 10,500-square-foot core exhibition show his life and presidency through photographs, documents, artifacts, memorabilia, film clips and a film about Truman's life.

President Truman and his wife, Bess are buried in the museum's courtyard. Museum visitors can also see two of Truman's offices -- the actual office he used at the Library and a replica of his Oval Office with a recorded message from him about the contents.

Currently, there is a special temporary exhibition called Saving the White House: Truman's Extreme Makeover. When the Trumans moved into the White House the building was desperately in need of repair and an inspection revealed that the first family was not safe inside. America's most famous historic home was basically demolished, giving birth to today's White House. Now, a new 3,000-sq ft museum exhibition by the Truman Library tells the dramatic story of the controversial \$5.7 million, 1,222-day renovation.

## Truman Talk: Harry Truman and "The Rich & Famous"

Archivist David Clark will share rare audio footage and personal correspondence to showcase President Truman's association with famous entertainers, politicians and athletes, including Jack Benny, Groucho and Harpo Marx, Bob Hope, Lyndon Johnson, John F. Kennedy, Richard Nixon, Babe Ruth and Mickey Mantle.
