
# **ANNUAL HEARING TESTS**

The Leavenworth Plant tested 247 people during a three day period for annual hearing tests. Those that haven't been tested and work in areas subject to noise levels over 82dBA for 8 hours will be scheduled for make up tests.

Soon, Hallmark employees in Leavenworth will go through an earplug "fit test". This test will test various earplugs in each individual's ear to measure what kind works best to help with noise reduction. The noise inside and outside the ear will be measured to determine the best kind for each employee.

Hearing protection is required in the Leavenworth plant anywhere on the floor past a yellow line. Earphones used for music are not hearing protection and are not allowed on the production floor. Approved earplugs are available in accessible locations throughout the plant. At the upcoming "fit test" you will be able to see which earplugs work best for you to help reduce noise in the workplace.

Every year, according to OSHA, noise related hearing loss has been listed as one of the most prevalent occupational health concerns in the United States for more than 25 years. **Hearing loss is preventable.** Do your part to protect yourself. Wear your ear protection properly and always.
